## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE—How Does Your Quilt Stash Grow?—Diane Grover

The Mother Goose nursery rhyme, Mary asks how does her garden grow. I love May as it signals the start of gardening season, though it's taken a long time to get my garden established. I first had to understand how the light was different between the north-east facing front yard and sun-drenched back. I've had to learn what wildlife frequents the area and which plants grow best with each other. In fact, even now, I still make changes and adapt to my needs, evolving taste and the availability of plants.

Creating a garden is very similar to curating my fabric stash. In the beginning, I had to learn how much fabric to buy, what colours worked best together and whether I needed to round out my palette. When my tastes changed, my fabric collection subtly shifted to reflect a more sophisticated style. As quilting has embraced a wider range of fabrics such as linen and shot cottons, as well as different printing techniques, my approach to buying fabric and quilting has had to keep up. Just like planting marigolds and tomatoes together is mutually beneficial, combining fibers and textures is now encouraged. I can grow my plants from seed or buy them already underway, much the same way I can cut my own fabric or buy precuts. I also give away some of my plants, as I do with excess fabric from stash. And with an increased emphasis on environmental stewardship, I see parallels in what flowers I plant and what fibers I acquire.

In fact, my fabric stash is a garden, planting the seed of inspiration that will eventually grow into a bounty of quilts.

## Here's your opportunity!!!

Tables will be set up with fabrics grouped by yardage (Yards, not metres). There will also be a limited amount of pre-cut batting (cuddle to crib sizes).

So, come with shopping bags, pattern ideas, and maybe a measuring tape.

For pattern selection, here are our clients' preferred sizes:

- Cuddle quilts 22" square
- Kids quilts from crib to twin 40" x 40" to 60" x 72" (older teens may be tall)
- Adult quilts twin (60" x 72") to queen
- Wheelchair guilts 36" x 36" to 36" x 40"

Once fabric choices are made, pick up an entry form for each quilt you plan to return before December 10 guild meeting. Pin the form to the quilt, and turn in to Community Projects table. Each form will be a chance to win a draw prize.

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


#### Quilter To Do List:

## 2024 CTQG Quilt Registration Info—Shirley Geiger

Only TWO months until the quilt show! It is time to register your quilts! Entry rules and registration forms are available on the guild website http://commonthreadquiltguild.ca/quilt-show/quilt-show-registration/.

Registering on-line is preferred. Please read the instructions carefully, and note the deadline of May 14, 2024.

Your quilt does not

have to be finished to register, just identifiable from your picture. Any questions may be sent to ctqg.quilt.show.registrar@gmail.com

You must hold a valid membership (2023-2024) in the CTQG to enter your quilts in the show. Your entry must not have been displayed at a previous CTQG show.

The categories eligible for prizes (voted on by the show attendees) are:

#### **BED QUILTS:**

- 1. LARGE: a guilt with a perimeter of 350" or greater (Maximum of 1 Entry)
- 2. MEDIUM: a quilt with a perimeter of 181" 349" (Maximum of 2 Entries)
- 3. SMALL: a guilt with a perimeter of 180" or less
- 4. MINIATURE: a quilt with a perimeter less than 96" total. If blocks are used they must be 4" or less. A bound full-size block is not considered a miniature, neither is a hexie quilt made with pieces ½" or greater. The overall pattern MUST show a miniaturization of a quilt.
- 5. ASSORTED QUILT ITEMS: Quilted clothing, bags, pillows, etc.
- 6. BLACK & WHITE PLUS ONE CHALLENGE: a guilt with a perimeter of 349" or less, made with black and white fabric (remember that black and white make grey), plus one other colour OR one other fabric (Maximum of 1 Entry)

#### SPECIAL EXHIBIT:

YOUTH: There are two non-voting categories for youth to show their quilting skills:

- a) youth 13 years and under
- b) youth between 14 and 17 years.

Age is determined by the entrant's age as of March 31, 2024. They can use any technique, but size is limited to less than 350" perimeter. Youth must be sponsored by a CTQG member (no membership fee required).

(Maximum of 1 Entry)

\*Guild President's Challenge quilts will not be voted upon, nor included in the show limit of quilts.

Members may submit up to five quilts. Depending upon the number and size of the quilts entered, entries may be limited to three. Please indicate on your registration form which quilt(s) you prefer to be withdrawn, if necessary.

The committee reserves the right to move an entry to a different category if appropriate.

You may request to have your quilt assessed at the show. The judge will provide, to you only, a confidential assessment of your quilt. Please complete the judging form on the website, and include when dropping off your quilt. Fee of \$10 may be e-transferred, or a cheque may be included with your form.

#### Please, ENTER your quilts! Your quilts make the show a success!

## **QUILT SHOW JUDGING—Janice Namiesniowski**

Ever wonder what a Quilt Judge would say about your quilt? The quilt that you laboured long and hard over, with blood, sweat, tears, time and money? You might ask; "why would I even think of inviting a professional to comment/give criticism on my quilting skills?

Simple answer is; because critiques are a valuable tool in your journey as a guilter.

Now, should you ever get brave enough to submit your quilt in a juried quilt show (i.e. QuiltCon, OMQG, CQA), you will receive an accept or reject letter from the Jury with no feedback. How will we every learn what a judge thinks of our quilt?

Yes, our friends and families have opinions, comments and critiques; but are they objective? Maybe. Are they "expert" in all facets of guilt composition? Most likely not.

#### You have a rare opportunity at the upcoming Common Thread Quilt Show 2024.

If you decide to enter your quilt in the 2024 Common Thread Quilt Show, you can choose to have your quilt submitted for a judging critique with the a certified CQA Quilt Judge. For only \$10.00 per quilt. Be assured that the resulted commentary is held in confidence with the judge & scribe and you (mailed to you via post). As Kirstin Fearon said in 2022, "You are getting objective advice. The judge is always looking for the best in your quilt, they will give you the good things you did with your quilt, and help you with some of those things that you cannot quite put your finger on something beautiful and functional. If you want to get some guidance on where you can dig a bit deeper into quilting, the judge's critique can help you with it."








## **REVISED CTQG CONSTITUTION**

All CTQG members will receive an email in a few weeks with a proposed revision to the Guild Constitution. This revised Constitution will be discussed and voted on by the membership at the June meeting. The proposed changes will be highlighted so members can see what is being proposed.

Revisions to the Guild Constitution were undertaken to meet the Ontario Government's legislation for NGOs. The deadline to comply with the legislation is October 2024. Our Guild is registered under Ontario Corporations Act, Not-for-Profit.

There were a number of technical changes: switching "Articles" and "ByLaws" and "Officers" and "Directors" to conform with legislation. Some language was changed to make it more flexible: "regular" instead of "monthly".

This is also a chance to review and change some ways we run our Guild. The draft that will be circulated has been discussed and approved by the Executive, and will be circulated to all members.

Coffee and tea will be available.






