COMMUNITY PROJECTS - Elizabeth Barr

We got off to a wonderful start in September thanks to all your hard work in the summer! We have got a special community project coming up. It involves YOU, scraps, and paper piecing! Retreat attendees will have the first opportunity to help!

Spotlight on HOSPICE CARE OTTAWA

Hospice Care Ottawa has 3 locations throughout our city which provide care for those in our community who are living with or have a loved one living with a palliative or life-limiting illness. They offer Day Hospice, In-Home Support, Caregiver Support and Bereavement Care. Every new In-Home client is gifted a care basket with one of our comfort quilts, but the need doesn't end there. When someone is no longer able to remain at home, Hospice also provides residential palliative care. May Court Hospice has 9 beds, 'Hein House' at the Ruddy Shenkman Hospice has 10 beds, and Maison de l'Est has 8 beds. They have said it would be wonderful to have quilts on each of these beds to have them feel more comforting and less clinical. Twin size quilts are needed, and we can help here as well. Pick up a kit and make a top, quilt a quilt, or bind a quilt.

Community Projects 2025 -2026 Panel Challenge!

Community Projects 2025 -2026 Panel Challenge! Come by the table and select a kit!

In this challenge, you may receive a large panel or a series of small, individual panels, a label and some additional coordinating fabric to use toward creating a fully finished quilt. You may want to dig into your fabric stash and find something that coordinates for binding, to augment backing, etc., and the idea is to have fun! You have 2 choices on how to face this challenge:

1. EASY DOES IT - Finish the challenge with the guidelines/pattern provided

OR

2. ALL IN - Use your creativity and come up with a layout of your own!

To be eligible for the draw (cash AND fabric!!), Panel Challenge Quilts must be turned in fully finished and bound by May 12, 2026. Here's how the draw works:

Choose the EASY DOES IT route, you will be given 1 (one) entry. Choose the ALL IN option, you will be given 2 (two) entries. **But wait... make your odds of winning even better!** Make a 4" sleeve to fit the quilt and SAFETY PIN it to the quilt to DOUBLE YOUR CHANCES! Imagine that - ALL IN with a 4" safety-pinned sleeve = 4 entries!

All Panel Challenge Quilts will be donated to our community partners following their proud display at our Guild's Quilt Show in June and the sleeves will be retained by the Guild for use in future displays as required. Only 5 Panel Challenge Kits are left. If you would like to participate in the challenge and would like one set aside for you, please email ctgg.community.projects@gmail.com. Otherwise, on meeting night, it will be first come, first served.

Friendly reminder if making tops and quilts, fabrics with any reference to violence and/or alcohol/substance use must be avoided. Quilts of the following sizes are always appreciated:

- ⇒ Cuddle quilts - 22" square
- ⇒ Wheelchair quilts - 36" x 36" to 36" x 40"
- ⇒ Kids quilts from crib to twin - 40" x 40" to 60" x 72" (older teens may be tall)
- ⇒ Adult Twin and Queen size quilts - 60" x 75" or larger
- ⇒ Comfort quilts - 50" x 60"

QUILT SHOW CATEGORY INFORMATION - Elizabeth Barr

2026 QUILT SHOW CATEGORIES

For our Quilt Show, held June 12th and 13th, 2026, eligible quilted items must be a 3-layer sandwich consisting of a top, batting, and backing.

VOTED CATEGORIES:

LARGE – Quilts with a perimeter of 281" or more

MEDIUM – Quilts with a perimeter between 181" – 280"

SMALL – Quilts, or quilted items, with a maximum perimeter of 180"

MINIATURE – Quilts with a maximum perimeter of 96" depicting a miniaturized version of a full-size quilt. If pieced blocks are used, individual blocks may not be larger than 4". A bound, individual block is not considered a miniature, nor is a ½" hexie

ART – Quilts in this category will include:

- ♥ Abstract & Improvisational – Non-pictorial with an emphasis on colour, line and design
- ♥ Depiction of Human or Animal Form – Illustrates a recognizable aspect of the human or animal form
- ♥ Landscapes & Still Life – Illustrates a recognizable aspect of natural or manmade scenery, or a recognizable object(s)

WEARABLES & ACCESSORIES – Garments, bags and pillows

- ♥ Distributing posters and bookmarks to quilt shops and other venues.

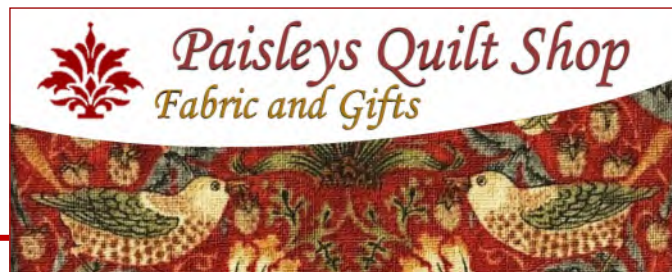

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ACQUILT GO! CUTTERS—Lynn Bradley

Two Accuquilt Go! and one Accuquilt Go Me! cutters and dies are available to Guild members during In-Person Sew Days and Retreats.

Members are free to drop by and cut their fabric during these times and are not obliged to pay for the Sew Day or Retreat if they stay for only a short time and only for the use of the Accu-quilt. For example, one is free to drop by with pre-ironed fabric and use the Accu-quilt for a short time. If your cutting time is preventing paying participants from ready access to the Accuquilt, or if you plan to use the iron for other than a quick touch-up, then perhaps paying for the day is warranted.

Plan ahead to cut out a quilt or just some blocks or appliques at the next SewDay or retreat.

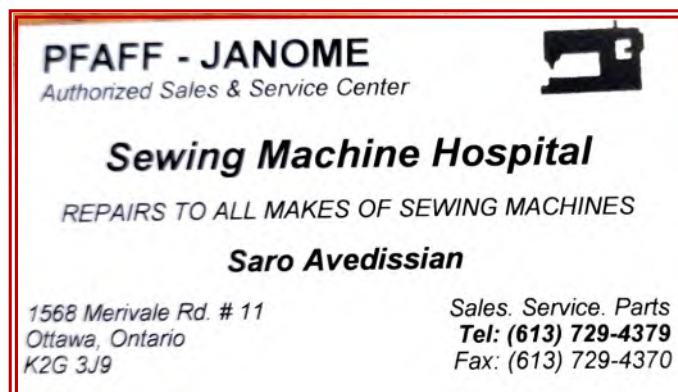

Introduction to Rope Bowls presented by Laura Malo

Class Description: Discover the art of transforming simple rope into beautiful, functional bowls in this hands-on sewing workshop! Perfect for beginners and confident sewists alike, this class will guide you through the entire process of coiling and stitching rope on a sewing machine to create sturdy, one-of-a-kind bowls.

You'll learn:

- How to prepare and handle rope for sewing
- Techniques for coiling and shaping your bowl
- Tips for adding color, fabric accents, or decorative stitching
- Finishing methods to give your project a professional look



By the end of the class, you'll leave with your own handcrafted rope bowl—perfect for organizing, decorating, or gifting—and the skills to make more at home.

Pictured samples will be at the September meeting if you want to take a closer look, and a supply list will be provided to participants. The class fee covers the cost of the rope.

About the Instructor: Laura Malo has been a member of our guild for many years and has held several positions of the executive, most recently as workshop coordinator. ARE YOU LOOKING TO JOIN A QUILTING GROUP?

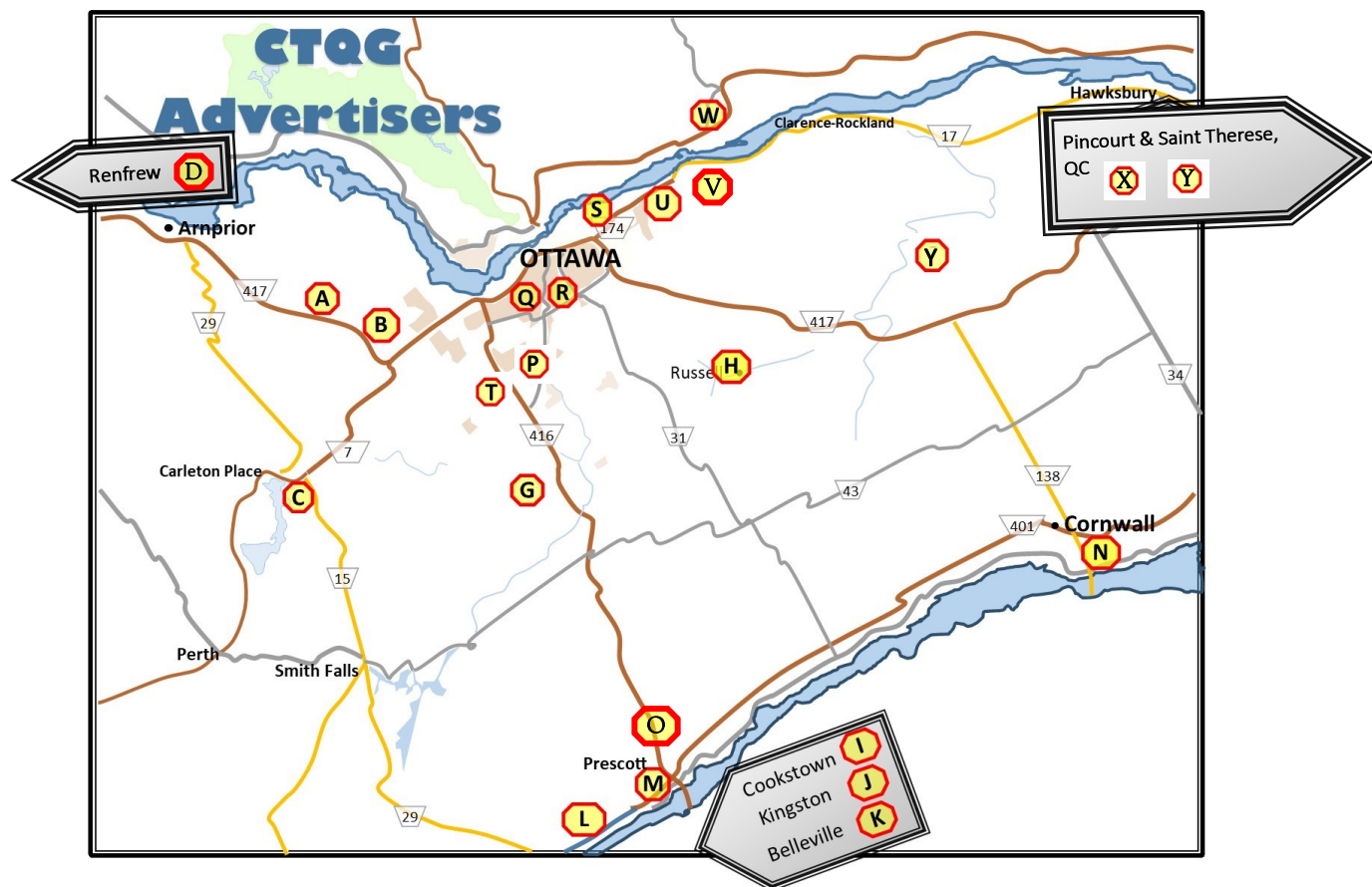
Look no further, the Gloucester 50+ Centre located at 4355 Belmont Drive (Pat Clark Community Centre) has drop-in quilting activities Mondays and Tuesdays from 9 am to 12 pm for those who are 50+.

You can bring your sewing machine, hand sewing, knitting or just come to chat and socialize with other quilters. You can join us for the whole 4 hours or not, it is totally up to you.

Rulers, irons, cutting boards, etc., are available. No set-up or take-down involved. At the end of the day, just put supplies back in the quilting storage cabinet. Oh, no need to bring lunch. There is a Food Services where you can still buy a sandwich for \$3.00 and a good homemade soup. Of course, you may bring your lunch and socialize with the quilters in the lunchroom. Lunch is served at 12 pm

Membership at the Centre is \$40 per year. The membership year is September 1 to August 31. New members will have a pro-rated membership one time only. Membership allows access to all drop in programs and registration for exercise and other classes. There is a \$2 drop-in fee for each week you attend quilting.
