Stay warm and cozy, avoiding icy roads and parking lots! To attend, register ahead of time by emailing ctgg.sewdays@gmail.com and you will be sent a Zoom link for each Virtual Sew Day. You don’t need to attend for the entire day – you can join and leave whenever you want, take a break to walk the dog, run an errand etc. We can even set up Zoom “Rooms” for small groups.

At the last Virtual Sew Day, we did an experiment to confirm that Zoom’s noise suppression algorithm really works: four of us ran our sewing machines right beside our computer or mobile device – and we never heard a stitch! Mind you, we can hear other background sounds like radios, TVs, pets, and your side conversation with your spouse, so keep that in mind.

We gratefully accept fabric donations and would like to offer a friendly reminder of what is most useful, should you choose to donate.

Guidelines for Fabric Donations:

- 100% quilting cotton
- 1/2m cuts minimum
- fabric should be less than 10 years old
- no content depicting anything related to alcohol, violence or that of a sexual nature

Partially or fully-assembled blocks without the pattern they were pieced for are best donated onto the sharing table for someone to take up the challenge.

Friendly Reminders:

★ All finished quilts need labels. We will provide a label, needle and thread and ask that you sew one on during the meeting if not already attached.

★ Fabrics with any reference to violence and/or alcohol/substance use must be avoided.

Quilts of the following sizes are always appreciated:

- ⇒ Cuddle quilts - 22" square
- ⇒ Wheelchair quilts - 36" x 36" to 36" x 40"
- ⇒ Kids quilts from crib to twin
- 40" x 40" to 60" x 72" (older teens may be tall)
- ⇒ Adult Twin and Queen size quilts
- 60" x 75" or larger
- ⇒ Comfort quilts - 50" x 60"

FAUX CATHEDRAL WINDOWS By Michelle Van Dyke

Class Description: This workshop invites quilters to explore the elegant illusion of cathedral windows - without the hand-sewn curves! Using the *Faux Cathedral Windows pattern* from Bits & Pieces Quilting, participants will learn how to create dimensional blocks that mimic the classic look with clever folding and stitching techniques. Make a quilt or a table runner, both available in beginner and advanced options.

Beginner Option - focuses on the main cathedral windows block and offers an easy finishing option with straightforward construction

Advanced Option - introduces a more advanced construction option that is more time consuming, but so worth the effort!

Whether you are new to quilting or looking to elevate your skills, this workshop delivers inspiration, technique, and a touch of textile magic.

About the Instructor: Michelle is a lifelong maker inspired by her mother and raised in southern Ontario's Mennonite country, where quilting was a way of life. From hand-quilting whole cloth quilts to machine piecing and quilting, she has developed a deep love for colour, design, and texture, with scrap quilts as her favourite creative playground. Today, quilting is both her passion and creative outlet.

Join Monika Henry for Improv For Planners, a full-day workshop where she teaches you her easy, not-intimidating method of making an improv quilt while still having control and structure throughout the process. And yes, the use of rulers is very much encouraged ;-)



About the Instructor: Monika is the designer and teacher behind Penny Spool Quilts, based in Ottawa, Canada, where she creates bright, modern quilt designs with a nod to tradition. Her own quilting journey started a bit over 20 years ago, when she was at university in Switzerland, with traditional patterns done the traditional way. And while she calls herself a modern quilter now, she still takes inspiration from traditional blocks and designs and tweaks them to suit her taste for modern fabrics, colours, and bold shapes.

First, second and third place winners in the four size categories will receive ribbons and small cash prizes.

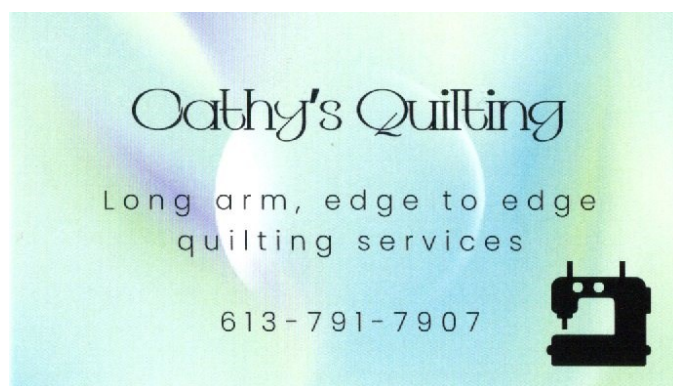
This year a CQA judge will also award ribbons for the following:

- ♥ Best use of colour
- ♥ Best applique
- ♥ Best original design
- ♥ Best hand quilting
- ♥ Best non-computerized quilting or best free motion

As in the past, the success of Quilt Show 2026 rests on the shoulders of our volunteers. There is a role for everyone—white glove, admissions, security, set up or tear down. Our Volunteer Coordinator, Lise Paradis, has made some wonderful changes to the volunteer registration process which will get underway in April. So, please, give some thought to volunteering for a shift or two. Those who volunteer will receive free admission to the show on the day they volunteer.

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CTQG QUILT SHOW CATEGORIES - Elizabeth Barr

2026 QUILT SHOW CATEGORIES

To be eligible, a quilt must be a 3-layer sandwich consisting of 2 layers of fabric with batting, or some other filler between, and be quilted.

MAIN CATEGORIES:

LARGE – Quilts with a perimeter of 281 or more”

MEDIUM – Quilts with a perimeter between 181” – 280”

SMALL – Quilts, or quilted items, with a maximum perimeter of 180”

MINIATURE – Quilts with a maximum perimeter of 96” depicting a miniaturized version of a full-size quilt. If pieced blocks are used, individual blocks may not be larger than 4”. A bound, individual block, ½” hexies and wholecloth are not considered miniatures.

ART – Quilts in this category will include:

- Abstract & Improvisational – Non-pictorial with an emphasis on colour, line and design
- Depiction of Human or Animal Form – Illustrates a recognizable aspect of the human or animal form
- Landscapes & Still Life – Illustrates a recognizable aspect of natural or manmade scenery, or a recognizable object(s)

WEARABLES & ACCESSORIES – Garments, bags, pillows, tea cozies etc. Items in this category are such that they are unable to be hung for display.

SPECIAL EXHIBIT CATEGORIES

Youth – made and/or quilted by a youth under 18 years of age. The youth must be sponsored by a CTQG member, and the youth’s age must be included in the description.

2024 – 2025 Party Bag Challenge

2025 – 2026 Panel Challenge

AWARDS OF MERIT

Ribbons will be awarded by a Canadian Quilter’s Association (CQA) certified judge in the following categories:

- Best hand quilting
- Best appliqué
- Best original design
- Best use of colour
- Best free-motion quilting, stationary or track

VIEWER’S CHOICE AWARDS

These awards are based on the Viewer’s Choice ballots submitted by quilt show attendees.

Ribbons will be awarded to:

- the top 3 Large quilts
- the top 3 Medium quilts
- the top 3 Small quilts
- the top 3 Miniature quilts
- the top 3 Art quilts
- the top 3 Wearables & Accessories quilts
- the overall favourite viewer’s choice

Cash prizes and/or ribbons will be awarded. Quilts within the Special Exhibit Categories are not judged.

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ACQUILT GO! CUTTERS—Joanne Villeneuve & Cathy Caron-Tatta

Two Accuquilt Go! and one Accuquilt Go Me! cutters and dies are available to Guild members during In-Person Sew Days and Retreats.

Members are free to drop by and cut their fabric during these times and are not obliged to pay for the Sew Day or Retreat if they stay for only a short time and only for the use of the Accu-quilt. For example, one is free to drop by with pre-ironed fabric and use the Accu-quilt for a short time. If your cutting time is preventing paying participants from ready access to the Accuquilt, or if you plan to use the iron for other than a quick touch-up, then perhaps paying for the day is warranted.



Plan ahead to cut out a quilt or just some blocks or appliques at the next SewDay or retreat.

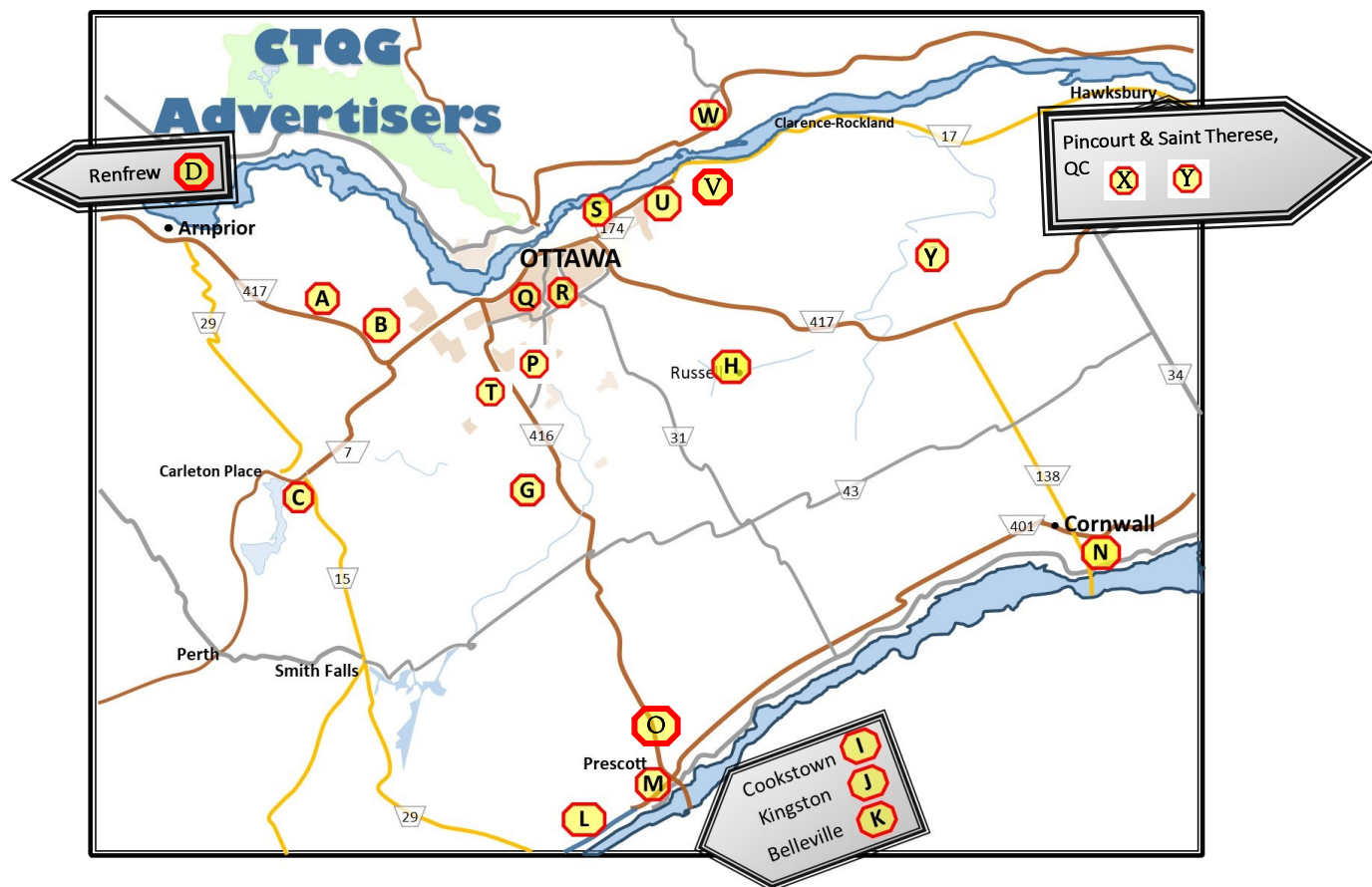
