Happy April! We are looking forward to seeing what you've been working on!

- Only one more month to complete the Panel Challenge! If you're ahead of the game, hold onto it until May and remember to DOUBLE your chances to win by safety pinning a sleeve to the back.
- Ensure any finished quilts have a CTQG label on them. If you need more or any quilts to be dropped off are missing a label, pick some up and bring a needle, thread and scissors with you so you can sew a label on during the meeting if you need to.

Not a big ask, but a REALLY BIG help: When donating tops or finished quilts, please note your name and the size of the top or quilt on a slip of paper sent along with it - that makes the intake and subsequent sorting go a lot faster. We thank you.

Quilts of the following sizes are always appreciated:

- ⇒ Cuddle quilts - 22" square
- ⇒ Wheelchair quilts - 36" x 36" to 36" x 40"
- ⇒ Kids quilts from crib to twin
 - 40" x 40" to 60" x 72" (older teens may be tall)
- ⇒ Adult Twin and Queen size quilts
 - 60" x 75" or larger
- ⇒ Comfort quilts - 50" x 60"

Her own quilting journey started a bit over 20 years ago, when she was at university in Switzerland, with traditional patterns done the traditional way. And while she calls herself a modern quilter now, she still takes inspiration from traditional blocks and designs and tweaks them to suit her taste for modern fabrics, colours, and bold shapes.

Hello Members,

It will be good to see everyone in person at our April Guild meeting at the Greenbelt Church!

There will be some important and necessary changes to how members apply and pay for membership starting in May 2026. At the April and May Guild meetings, I will be showing presentations that outline the changes and how to use our website to apply and pay for Membership. On our website, there will be a link to 'Zeffy' a Canadian company who only works with non-profit organisations (currently used by the Modern Quilt Guild). Using this platform on our website will be a more efficient way for the Guild to process memberships and payments.

Here are the basic changes, starting in **May 2026**:

- Applications must be completed online through our website
- Payments can only be made with credit or debit cards, online through our website

Over the next few months, there will be presentations, flyers and posters to ease the transition. Volunteers with their computer devices will also be available in June, September and October to help you use your debit or credit card to apply and pay online for membership. Further details to follow.

The current application form has been removed from the website, if you need to join the Guild now, for the Quilt Show, please email me as soon as possible for information ctqg.membership@gmail.com. The new application and payment platform will be available to use on the website from May 1st, 2026. Please note the Guild year runs from July 1st 2026 to June 31st 2027.

SECRETARY: The role of Secretary is basically to:

- ◆ Create the agenda for the monthly Guild Executive meeting;

- ◆ Prepare the Minutes of each Executive meeting;
- ◆ Send out the minutes to the Executive with a Zoom link prior to the monthly meeting
- ◆ Once the minutes are approved, send a copy the Website Administrator.
- ◆ Familiarity with Google Workspace is an asset.



MEMBERSHIP COORDINATOR: The role of the Membership Coordinator is basically to:

- ◆ Register members and process payments;
- ◆ Maintain and update membership lists;
- ◆ Attend monthly executive meetings;
- ◆ Write brief "Membership News" article for the newsletter;
- ◆ This role could be shared between two people!



RETREAT COORDINATORS: This role is best shared between two people: an administration role and a kitchen role!

- ◆ Administration role means looking after the registrations and payment for the retreat, getting volunteer cooks and bakers, sending out notifications to attendees and reimbursing expenditures.
- ◆ Kitchen role means buying groceries needed to complete the meals and snacks, organizing volunteers for kitchen jobs and ensuring that meals are served.

ACQUILT GO! CUTTERS—Joanne Villeneuve & Cathy Caron-Tatta

Two Accuquilt Go! and one Accuquilt Go Me! cutters and dies are available to Guild members during In-Person Sew Days and Retreats.

Members are free to drop by and cut their fabric during these times and are not obliged to pay for the Sew Day or Retreat if they stay for only a short time and only for the use of the Accu-quilt. For example, one is free to drop by with pre-ironed fabric and use the Accu-quilt for a short time. If your cutting time is preventing paying participants from ready access to the Accuquilt, or if you plan to use the iron for other than a quick touch-up, then perhaps paying for the day is warranted.

Plan ahead to cut out a quilt or just some blocks or appliques at the next SewDay or retreat.

Look no further! The Gloucester 50+ Centre located at 4355 Belmont Drive (Pat Clark Community Centre) has drop-in quilting activities Mondays and Tuesdays from 9 am to 12 pm for those who are 50+.

You can bring your sewing machine, hand sewing, knitting or just come to chat and socialize with other quilters. You can join us for the whole 4 hours or not, it is totally up to you.

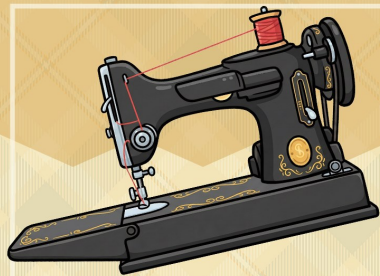
Rulers, irons, cutting boards, etc., are available. No set-up or take-down involved. At the end of the day, just put supplies back in the quilting storage cabinet. Oh, no need to bring lunch. There is a Food Services where you can still buy a sandwich for \$3.00 and a good homemade soup. Of course, you may bring your lunch and socialize with the quilters in the lunchroom. Lunch is served at 12 pm

Membership at the Centre is \$40 per year. The membership year is September 1 to August 31. New members will have a pro-rated membership one time only. Membership allows access to all drop in programs and registration for exercise and other classes. There is a \$2 drop-in fee for each week you attend quilting. 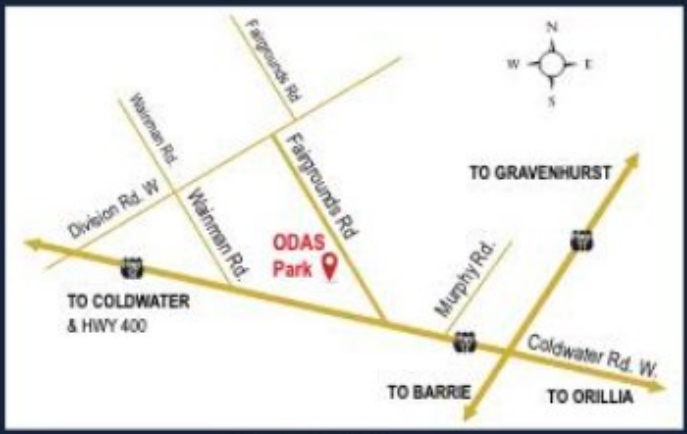

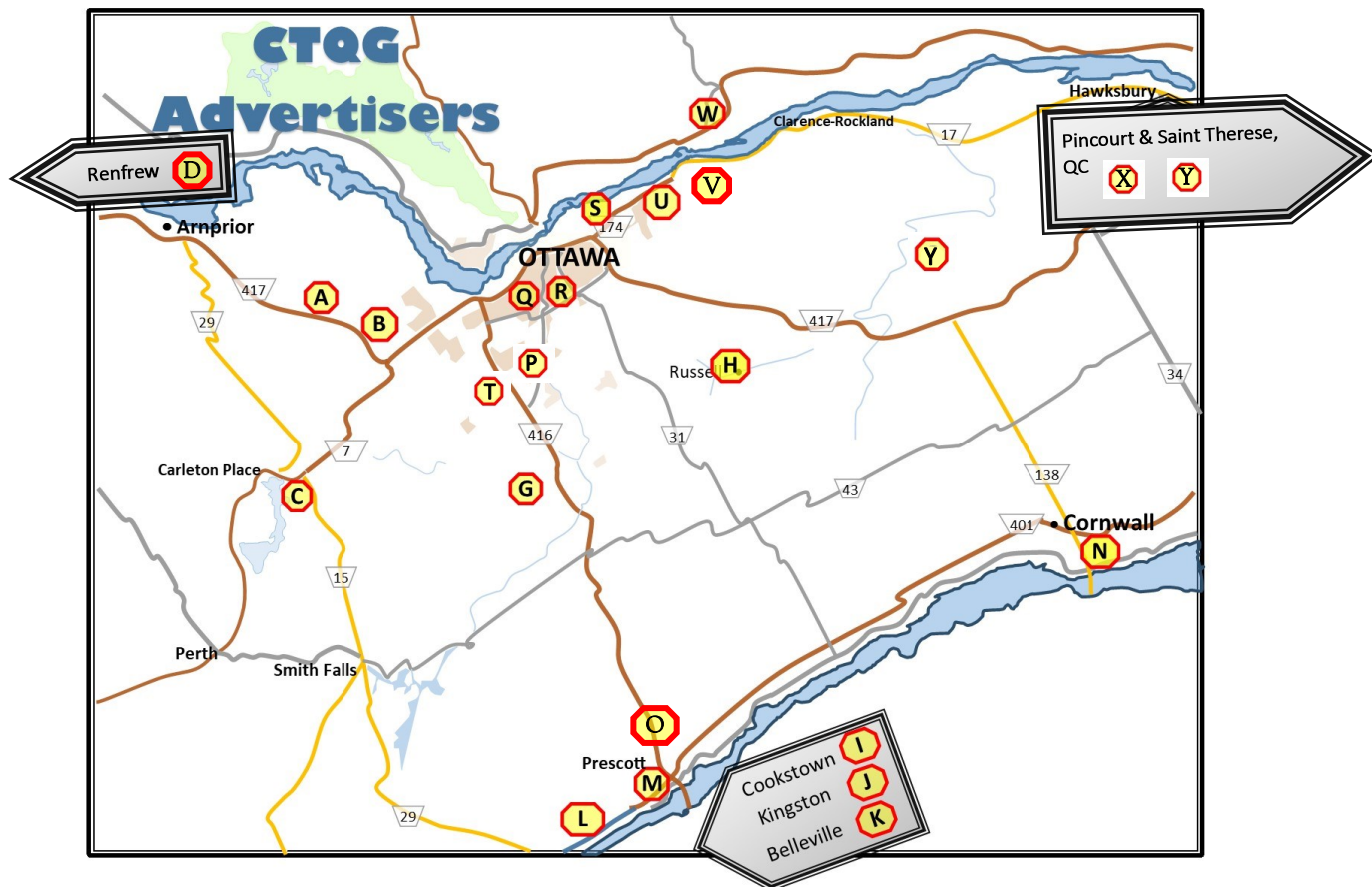
